We are very confident that we will be able to put this trailer to good use at various community events throughout the year, in addition to many crime-prevention initiatives in which we are involved.

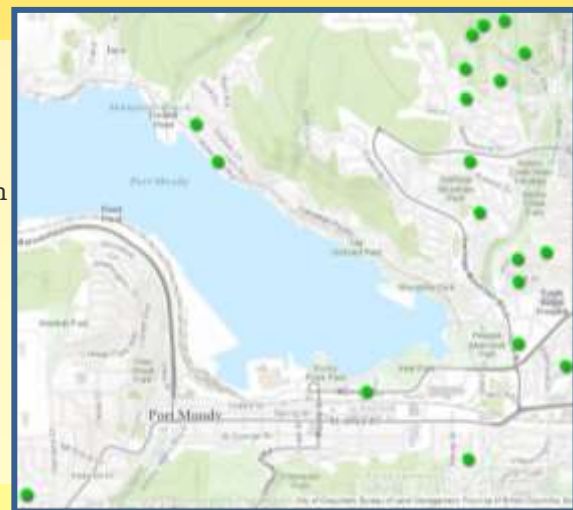
