

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF CONSTABLE

Thank you for taking a look at our 2018 Community Report! Our members, staff, and volunteers are so incredibly proud of the Port Moody Police Department. 2018 was another exceptional year for public safety in the City of Port Moody.

One of the highlights of 2018 was the establishment of a specialized new position that deals with cases of domestic violence. This position, approved with the full support of the Police Board and City Council, is filled by an experienced investigator and allows us to provide more comprehensive risk assessments on these difficult cases.

Another 2018 highlight was the acquisition of our Mobile Community Service Unit. This is a specialized trailer that we bring to all the community events we attend to offer crime prevention tips and information. It can also double as a mobile command post, and the best part is that the trailer was donated to us by the Rotary Club of Port Moody! We cannot thank the Rotary enough for this generous donation and for their partnership in this project.

On the topic of crime, the Port Moody Police Department is pleased with the crime statistics for 2018. Property crimes decreased 11.2 % from 2017 for the lowest rate we've seen in several years. Break and enters were down 21%, with a significant reduction (over 40%) in residential B&Es. Thefts from automobiles were down 7% and theft of automobiles decreased by 10%. Compared to 2017, we experienced a slight reduction (5%) in our overall calls for service, while crimes against persons increased by seven (7) incidents.

Road safety continues to be a top local priority for police and the community. The number of formal written traffic warning tickets increased by 29% over 2017 data. Over 1,400 violation traffic fine tickets were issued and PMPD conducted 224 impaired driving investigations, an increase of 23% since 2017.

Our members, staff, and volunteers continue to be highly dedicated to public safety and continue to increase their efforts to prevent and reduce crime, modify bad driving behaviour through a number of strategies, and engage with our community. I am incredibly proud of the work our staff is doing to make Port Moody even more liveable.

The Port Moody Police Board is responsible for providing oversight and direction to the Police Department in accordance in and consistent with the Police Act. The Board works with the Chief Constable and the Senior Management team to develop and approve the departments strategic plan, annual plan, budget and objectives and policies.
