Our 2019 Annual Report statistics show that our officers issued 1854 traffic tickets, 3593 warnings, handled 230 impaired driving files, dealt with 612 incidents involving a mental health component, investigated 168 thefts from autos, 73 break & enters, 165 crimes against person(s), and 509 calls for an emergency in progress. There are countless other stats too.

However, sometimes it's the small things we do that matter most, and ultimately leave the biggest impression.

These little interactions with our community cannot be, and should never be quantified through any type of statistical analysis.

After all, their meaning and impact speak for themselves.

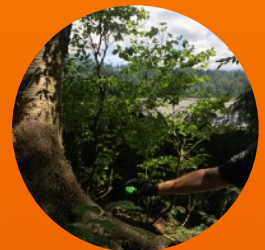


DID'JA KNOW

Community Engagement

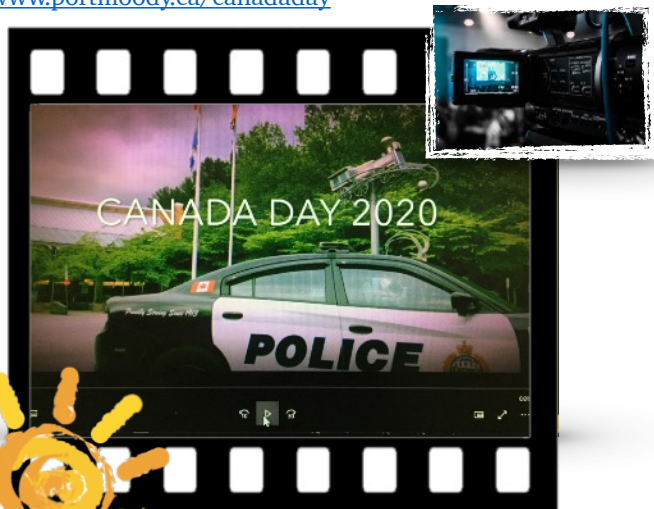
It's gearing up to be a fun if not "unique" summer for the Community Services section of the PMPD.
