On behalf of the Police Board, I am pleased to present the 2023 Port Moody Police Community Report. The information contained in this report shows the work that has been done - both inside the organization and out in the community - to carry out the mission and achieve the goals set out in the PMPD's 2021-2023 Strategic Plan.

The PMPD's mission – to serve and protect the community of Port Moody, with excellence – is taken very seriously by everyone within the Department. In 2023, the PMPD received more than 7,200 calls for

service, including 462 emergency calls. You will find other statistics in this report such as the number of written traffic violation tickets and road safety warnings, and the number of impaired driving and collision investigations. These are not just numbers – they represent real situations and real people, and the PMPD's response has a real, tangible, and long-lasting impact. Every day, the professional and hard-working members of the PMPD are making our community a safer place for residents, businesses (employers and employees), and visitors.

The Police Board and the Department have focused on two overarching goals during the period covered by the Strategic Plan: creating a safe and engaged community; and maintaining and evolving a capable organization. Through dedication, innovation, outreach, and learning, we achieved these goals in small and big ways every day in 2023. Highlights include:

- 1. adding an exchange zone in front of PMPD headquarters this zone is a safe, neutral location where people can meet and complete online transactions or transfer children between parents and/or quardians;
- 2. collaborating with the City of Port Moody's Recreation Division to offer three safety workshops (two for women and one for seniors); and
- 3. training for Police Board members through completion of a BC Police Board Training Program course offered by the Province, Board members gained valuable

MESSAGE FROM THE

CHIEF CONSTABLE



I hope you enjoy reading the 2023 Port Moody Police Community Report. There is a lot in here that we are proud of.

This report pulls together highlights that showcase some important statistics and achievements from 2023. You will find that calls for our service have increased 7.4 per cent from 2022. Auto theft has risen but is still not common for Port Moody. At the same time, we are pleased that theft from automobiles and break and enters were both reduced from 2022 levels.

We continue to focus on crime prevention and road safety and are very proud of the low rate of criminal victimization in our city. In April 2023, our Department was thoroughly tested with a very serious kidnapping that received significant media and police attention. With incredible support from surrounding police services, we are thankful the victim was located quickly and safely. The matter is before the courts but many of the accused persons have already accepted responsibility and plead guilty.

In 2023, we were thrilled to celebrate a few special milestones. One was the 10-year anniversary of the PMPD Community Garden on July 15, 2023. We also hosted a very successful Youth Academy for senior high school students who show interest in a future career in policing and public safety. There were successful fundraisers for pediatric cancer with our Cops for Cancer ride, for Special Olympics with our Law Enforcement Torch Run and Polar Plunge, and for Eagle Ridge Hospital with the Night in Nashville concert.

I am incredibly proud of all the individuals who serve in the PMPD. All our employees are thrilled to serve the City of Port Moody. We continue to enjoy outstanding support from Mayor and Council, the Police Board, the Port Moody Police Services Union, CUPE Local 825, and those who live, work, and play in Port Moody. Thank you for your continued support.




CRIMES AGAINST PERSON




PMPD IN THE COMMUNITY
